


DAPHNE'S WORK PORTFOLIO



PH.D. IN BIOMINICRY

I was among the first three students to get a Ph.D. in Biomimicry from the University of Akron. We shaped the program, cocreated the curriculum, and went beyond existing boundaries and beliefs. I blogged, researched, published, gave keynotes, and I was a mentor for new students. I co-founded Hedgemon, a result of a design class in which we invested hedgehogs as inspiration to create an impact-absorbing material against concussions. I interviewed 50+ end-users, wrote the business plan and secured \$25k seed investment. Hedgemon is an Innovation Fund Awardee to compete in the NFL helmet challenge.











BALANCE, DESIGN INTERNSHIP

My role at the design studio Balance, Inc. was to infuse Biomimicry Thinking within their way of working.

I enabled their innovation team to shift from thinking outside the box to simply thinking outside. One of my ideas was adopted for a client project. We were invited to give a TEDxCLE talk, "From spider webs to elevators: leveraging biomimicry," capturing our lessons learned.







JASWIG, CO-FOUNDER

Motivated by my own need and the realization that "sitting is the new smoking," I, together with a structural engineer and a woodworker, developed an award-winning sustainable standing desk. Together, we went through ideation, prototyping, testing, and pitching. We successfully created a truly human-centered and eco-conscious product. We raised >\$74k in crowdfunding on Kickstarter. As a co-founder, I took on many hats: designer, website developer, campaigner, community builder, team manager, and business developer. Our first institutional customers were closed, thanks to me.

I'm most proud when people tell me they now stand when waiting for the bus instead of sitting.

Jaswig was acquired by Knoll, Inc. in 2019.













XPLANE, INNOVATION INTERNSHIP

"How can we turn complex ideas into simple explanations that everyone can understand?" XPLANE's Visual Thinking approach has an answer for that important question. In addition, I developed new tools to optimize their internal idea-capturing process to support better collaboration and co-creation amongst colleagues.




What can **bats** teach us about **avoiding collisions**?

SUPERPOWER: Echolocation allows "seeing" without eyes

Bats, nocturnal birds, whales and dolphins use echolocation to "see" in the dark, by emitting clicks and listening for the echoes that bounce off objects.







What can we build based on "seeing" through sound?

Some blind people use echolocation to help them navigate, but very few learn to do it well. We can develop tools, like a bike, that help blind people "see" better based on echolocation.

How else could echolocation improve safety? How could it be used to help us find things? "How would nature solve it?" Another question I love asking.

I've applied Biomimicry Thinking for many different types of challenges: Cleaning sewage pipes, inspiring visitors at the zoo to think creatively about bio-inspired design, developing a visualization platform to support collaboration in virtual teams, building a framework for anti-fragile organizations, ... to list a few. I've advised C-level, entrepreneurs, students, and governmental institutions.

My journey resembled the fuzzy front end of innovation. Luckily, I quickly started seeing where it was leading. Being an innovation consultant made me connect the dots alot easier. I've trained and coached 250+ employees in their design thinking and business model innovation journeys. Industry focus of corporate clients included finance, food & beverage, media, and transportation. A simple addition of "Integrity" to the innovation sweet spot resulted in the most popular article posted in BOI's 10-year existence.


I like challenging the status quo - especially to make it benefit our world.

Being anti-fragile to changing conditions, I temporarily became an independent planet-centered strategist and designer.


Even though my most creative achievement was bringing to life a beautiful daughter,

 job satisfaction and better growth perspectives, which was piloted in 5 daycares.










BIOMIMICRY 3.8, PRINCIPAL BIOMIMIC












MY OCTOPONION APPROACH
